Earl Smith Strand Theatre 117 North Park Square Marietta, GA 30060

The Strand is located on the north side of the historic Marietta Square at the corner of Cherokee St. and North Park Sq.

Going north on 75

Get off on exit 263 toward Marietta and merge onto South Marietta Parkway. After 2.8 miles, take a right onto Atlanta Road. After 0.4 miles, The Strand Theatre will be on your left at the northeast corner of the historic Marietta Square.

Going south on 75

Get off on exit 265 and take a right onto North Marietta Parkway. After I.4 miles, take a left onto Church Street. After 0.4 miles, take a left onto North Park Square. The Strand Theatre will be on your left at the northeast corner of the historic Marietta Square.



Strand FAQ

Q: Do you offer tours?

A: We offer private tours to groups of 10 or more. Just call our box office to schedule!

Q: When can I look inside The Strand?

A: The Strand is typically closed when there's not an event going on. We do often have non-ticketed events such as Brew with a View or free movie nights that allow newcomers to take a look around certain areas of the facility.

Q: When is your box office open?

A: Our Box Office is open from 9 AM- noon and I PM -4 PM Monday through Friday. Box office is also open 2 hours before all ticketed events.

Q: How can I found out what is happening at The Strand?



sub-par action film when you can come down to the Earl Smith Strand Theatre to see some timeless classics?





Waverly's precocious granddaughter, Susan Waverly.

Others in the cast include Becca Potter, Kelly Chapin Schmidt, Priscilla Curtis, Jessica Bailey Pack, Fenner Eaddy, Ian Blanco, Natalie Rhae Goodwin, Craig Baker, and J. Koby Parker.

Atlanta Lyric Theatre's production of *Irving Berlin's White Christmas* will also feature Ron Carter on the Strand's Mighty Allen Theatre Organ fifteen minutes prior to each curtain playing your favorite holiday carols.

Inside The Director's Studio: A Sneak Peek at *Steel Magnolias* Staff Writer Manda Costoulas

There are few shows that can really capture the heart and soul of southern living, and it's hard to imagine one better than *Steel* Magnolias. Named for the strength of steel and the delicacy of flowers, Steel Magnolias is a funny and at times heartbreaking look inside the lives of six southern women. Steel Magnolias is coming to The Strand stage in January of 2013. Earl Reece, the Executive Director of The Strand and the director of Steel Magnolias answers some questions on the show, working with the cast, and the future of The Strand. Patron: All of the action of the play takes place solely on one set – Truvy's beauty salon – and there are only six characters in the show. Are working with those types of restraints challenging?

Earl Reece: One of the best things about this cast is the fact that they are working on the show because they love performing and are committed to helping The Strand. I actually proposed this show to Kim Gresh and Cassandra Buckalew over a year ago. They take Strand projects very seriously. Ouiser is the character who is outspoken, blunt, to the point and aggressively opinionated. Who better to play this part than Kim Gresh? No one is more loved and respected in our community than these two ladies. It's fun to work with great friends. I think the setting—Truvy's beauty shop—is perfect.

P: We'll be seeing a few repeat performances by community members that have starred in other productions on The Strand stage – such as *The* Odd Couple and The Sunshine Boys. I'm referring, of course, to the dramatic duo Kim Gresh and Cassandra Buckalew. How is working with two such dynamic personalities?

ER: Everyone in the community knows that Kim, Cassandra, and I talked with Kim, and I told are close personal friends. The amount of energy and enthusiasm accent, just talk the way you that they bring to the stage is refreshing. I do have to admit that there are times when I have to encourage them to stay on task and remain focused. They get so "into" what they are doing that it's hard not to get caught up in their excitement.

P: Is it a challenge or a blessing to work with material as wellknown as Steel Magnolias, especially here in the South?

ER: Any time you are working with an iconic show like Steel Magnolias, there are challenges. The one thing that I don't want to do is make the

show a cartoon. I've already her—do not talk in a Southern normally do. It's funny to watch a movie about the south. We frequently comment that "we don't sound like that", when honestly we sound worse - or maybe better.

P: What were some of the deciding factors in bringing this show to The Strand?

ER: Perfect timing, perfect script, and perfect cast.

P: Like every artistic industry, theatre has taken a hit economically since the late-2000's collapse. In the shadow of tough economic times, what is The Strand's motivation to continue producing quality and accessible live entertainment?

ER: The Lyric does a great job producing and presenting musical theatre to our community. Steel Magnolias is an extremely popular play that has a message for everyone. We are fortunate to have great support from our friends, our patrons, and our community and city leaders.

Steel Magnolias will be playing the third weekend in January at The Strand.

While there are several perks that come with volunteering as an usher, the main highlight is getting to meet and assist patrons. Don't believe us? Take it from the ushers themselves:






