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

The Strand is located on the north side of the historic Marietta Square at the corner of Cherokee St. and North Park Sq.

Going north on 75

Get off on exit 263 toward Marietta and merge onto South Marietta Parkway. After 2.8 miles, take a right onto Atlanta Road. After 0.4 miles, The Strand Theatre will be on your left at the northeast corner of the historic Marietta Square.

Going south on 75

Get off on exit 265 and take a right onto North Marietta Parkway. After 1.4 miles, take a left onto Church Street. After 0.4 miles, take a left onto North Park Square. The Strand Theatre will be on your left at the northeast corner of the historic Marietta Square.

From the Big Chicken at Cobb Parkway & Roswell Rd Go west on Roswell Road toward Marietta. After 1.7 miles take a right onto East Park Sq. and The Strand Theatre will be on your left at the northeast corner of the historic Marietta Square.

From Barrett Parkway and Dallas Highway Go east on Dallas Hwy. toward Marietta. After 1.5 miles, Dallas Hwy. turns into Whitlock Ave. Continue for 2.7 miles until you run into the Marietta Square. Take a left onto East Park Square. The Strand Theatre will be on your left at the northeast corner of the historic Marietta Square.

I am happy to be able to support The Strand in a small way by volunteering. I have made a lot of wonderful friends here, and I love meeting and greeting the **patrons.** "




Strand Snapshot!

Local music lovers and performers alike will enjoy an evening filled with personality, good humor, and great local music in The Strand's fourth level event room and rooftop terrace.

Bert Reeves, attorney and former assistant Cobb County D.A.. "This is the kind of event that can build a lot of momentum and become a regular occurrence, while giving our local performers a way to bring their talent to our community."

Open Mic Nights will be held on July 8, 15, 22, and 29 from 7 p.m. to 10:30 p.m. with Andrew Cole as the Emcee. Doors open at 5:45 p.m. with a cash **bar opening at 6 p.m. and serving \$3 beer and \$5 wine specials all night. It's** free to listen and perform. There will be limited seating available.

Performer Registration:

Bands or individuals must register in advance to schedule their "open mic" time. Sign up begins 30 days in advance via email and closes 24 hours before the doors open. Performers are asked to email name, age, tech needs, genre, the number of performers in the act, and any additional performance info to andrew@earlsmithstrand.org and confirmations will be returned with performance time.

There are 20 slots per night. Each performance will be limited to a two-song or eight-minute performance. No drum kits, effects petals, or tracking allowed and group performances may not exceed four members. The Strand will provide two ¼ inch guitar cables, two XLR Mic Cables, two Shure SM58 Vocal Mics, Mic Stands, Keyboard and a PA system.

Summer Camp at The Strand

The Earl Smith Strand Theatre is launching a new musical theatre camp called *Performula: A Musical Theatre Laboratory*! Students will focus on music, dance, and drama in this week-long camp, culminating in a Friday night performance on The Strand's Stephen W. Imler Stage.

"The *Performula* concept will be based upon active participation by each of the campers as they experience what is involved with becoming a trained performer," said Earl Reece, Strand executive director and camp director. "They will accomplish a great deal in 15 hours!"

Performula camp was developed by Strand Executive Director Earl Reece. The former educator-turned-theatre director served as the director of the Cobb County Center for Excellence in the Performing Arts at Pebblebrook High School for 14 years, significantly growing the program while preparing students for the real world of performing PERFORMULA =

arts. Under his leadership, graduates of the Pebblebrook program secured millions in scholarships to a long list of prestigious universities and performed on Broadway in close to 30 shows and in numerous national tours.

Each camp session lasts for five half-days, Monday through Friday. Students can sign up for a week-long session July 11-15 or July 25-29. Students will be grouped by grade level, with rising fourth through rising seventh grade from 9 a.m. to noon, and rising eighth through twelfth grade from 1 to 4 p.m.

The price is \$150 per student and only 50 spots are available per age group per week. Saying "I Do" at The Strand

Wedding bells are ringing at the Earl Smith Strand Theatre as the venue continues to offer more than just movies.

On May 30, 2009, Tyler Richardson and Jamie Savincki made history as the first couple to tie the knot on the stage of Marietta Square's Strand Theatre.

"It was a day that I will always remember and I know that my friends and family will, too," said Savincki-Richardson, a native of Marietta.

Jamie and Tyler met when performing in a stage show together. In honor of their first meeting, the couple decided to get married onstage. After hearing about the renovation of The Strand, they chose to have their wedding at the theatre because of the festive ambiance and the large capacity of the venue.

"The atmosphere was elegant but also casual and relaxed," said Savincki-Richardson. "It was perfect."

The art deco theatre provided a unique atmosphere for the

wedding, with music performed on the theatre's organ by Ira Pitman, the organist of Mt. Bethel United Methodist Church.

On the day of the ceremony, the historic theatre's 1930s replica marquee proclaimed "Congratulations Tyler and Jamie Richardson" to all visitors to the square.

"Out of all the wedding ceremonies I've conducted, this is the best facility for a ceremony outside of a church," said Dr. Jim Bradshaw, the officiant of the ceremony.

Father and mother of the bride, Stanley and Joyce Savincki, welcomed more than 200 guests to the wedding. **The reception took place in both of The Strand's charming** event rooms, boasting coffered ceilings, etched windows and teardrop chandeliers rescued from a historic hotel in Atlanta. Guests also enjoyed an excellent view of Marietta Square, Glover Park, and Kennesaw Mountain from the **theatre's rooftop "Cobb Terrace."**

"The facilities met our needs perfectly and the staff was very professional, attentive and helpful," said Stanley Savincki. "I don't think it could have been any better."

Since this May 2009 wedding, 13 couples have tied the knot at The Strand and over 30 have cut the cake in the private event space.

In addition to weddings and wedding receptions, the venue is commonly used for rehearsal dinners, wedding receptions, holiday parties, art shows, corporate workshops, lectures and other events. The theatre offers catering from a variety of vendors, including Carriage **House Catering, Gabriel's Desserts, Dave Poe's BBQ, and** Sugar Cakes.

All renters of any of the theatre's event spaces are eligible for a 10% discount on engraved bricks and commemorative theatre seats.

The historic Earl Smith Strand Theatre in Marietta, Ga. is dedicated to showcasing all forms of art – film, stage productions, concerts, theatre organ concerts, festivals, televised events, fashion shows, art shows, and private events. The 1935 theatre reopened in January 2009 after seven years of renovation efforts with the help of Friends of the Strand, Inc., a devoted group of community leaders. The Strand aims to enhance the cultural fabric of the Marietta community through the presentation of the finest arts possible while supporting the advancement of arts education.



The lush romantic musical *The* Light in the Piazza, winner of six Tony Awards, will whisk audiences away to Italy in the summer of 1953. A business man's wife tours the countryside with her daughter who falls for a young Florentine boy. But mother knows a secret - should she talk or let fate run its course?



The final collaboration between Rodgers & Hammerstein, The Sound of *Music* was destined to become the world's most beloved musical. When a nun proves too high-spirited for the religious life, she is dispatched to serve as governess for the seven children of a widowed naval Captain, and gradually falls in love with him. But the honeymoon is cut short as Austria is invaded by Nazis.



Gypsy is considered by many the greatest American musical ever, loosely based on the 1957 memoirs of Gypsy Rose Lee, the famous striptease artist. Gypsy follows the dreams and efforts of a mama raising two daughters in show business. The musical contains popular standards including Small World, Everything's Coming up Roses, Some People, and Let Me Entertain You.








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Junior League: Making an Impact for Women and Children

Perhaps your mind revisits your yearly shopping tradition at Mistletoe Market, picking up one-of-a-kind gifts and sampling great food. Maybe your mind drifts to that well-worn and foodstained cookbook with your family's favorite recipes dog-eared.

For 78 years, the members of the JLCM have had a transformative impact on the lives of women and children through our volunteer and financial support. Established 1933, it was the desire of several women to help those in need. Today, our organization has grown to over 400 women who share that vision.

Our members work hard all year long to bring together great fundraisers like Mistletoe Market and the Marietta Mardi Gras Run. But do you know why? These fundraisers allow us to give back to organizations in our community like The Center for Children and Young Adults, The Center for Family Resources, Cobb County Safety Village, Cobb County Youth Museum, Communities in Schools, Omosaze, SafePath, and the YWCA. We contribute more than \$15,000 in grants and the equivalent of \$200,000 in volunteer service hours each year through our philanthropic efforts. With more than ¾ of our members working outside the home this is quite an accomplishment. We are lawyers, teachers, doctors, wives, mothers, and business owners. The League also partners with other local nonprofit organizations, such as The Strand, to serve Cobb families. This year, the JLCM, along with a number of other organizations and businesses, hosted a foster family event at The Strand. Nearly 50 families attended and the kids enjoyed a day of face painting, crafts, snacks, and a spectacular show by local magician, Joe M. Turner. This is just one of the ways the JLCM works with our community partners to identify and meet the ever-changing needs of families and children living in Cobb. We could not further our mission without the continual support received by community organizations.

Our mission is to promote voluntarism, develop the potential of women, and improve our community. Whether it is reading books to young children; teaching young adults to cook healthy meals; educating elementary students on American history; helping a mom earn her GED; collecting diapers; or painting a building - we are improving the quality of life for all of us who live, work and play here in Cobb County.



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
